PATIENT CARE TECHNICIAN TRAINING PROGRAM

300 Clock Hours (220 Hours Theory, 40 Hours Clinical and 40 Hours Externship)

The Patient Care Technician Training Program is a 300-clock hour program that prepares the student for an entry-level position in health care with specific focus on direct patient care services in a hospital or ambulatory care unit. The course trains the student on technical skills necessary to perform personal care to complex patients as well as implement selected portions of care plans including respiratory services, rehabilitation services, EKG and phlebotomy under the supervision of registered nurses. Students are required to complete 40 hours of Clinical Externship after completing requirements of the three main programs, to prepare them for employment. After successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to sit for the National Healthcareer Association Certification Exam. This is a multi-certification program whereby students earn individual diplomas and eligibility for certification as Patient Care Technicians, Nursing Assistants, Phlebotomists (with additional externship hours), and EKG Technicians.

BASIC NURSING ASSISTANT TRAINING PROGRAM HYBRID [ONLINE & FACE-TO-FACE]

130 Clock Hours (50 Hours Online Theory + 40 Hours Laboratory + 40 Hours Clinical)

The Basic Nursing Assistant Training Program is a 4 to 10-week program that prepares students into their roles and responsibilities as nursing assistants in long term care facilities and other health care settings. Through online readings, lectures, testing, supervised laboratory and actual clinical experience, students are provided with the knowledge and skills needed to provide basic nursing care for patients in various health care facilities. Students are eligible to take the IL Nurse Aide Written Competency Exam after successful completion of the program. The BNAT Hybrid Program is approved by the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH).

This course follows the BNATP Model Program of IDPH The curriculum is designed to provide the students with knowledge and skills necessary to perform entry-level tasks of an IL Certified Nursing Assistant in the following clusters: communicating information, performing basic nursing skills, performing personal care skills, providing basic restorative skills, mental health, social services, and residents' rights.

PHLEBOTOMY

190 Clock Hours (100 Hours Theory & Laboratory and 90 Hours Externship)

The Phlebotomy program is a 190 clock-hour program that prepares the student for a career in the clinical laboratory sciences. The program is designed to train the student in intravenous blood withdrawals and specimen collection for the purpose of laboratory analysis. Course work includes proper specimen collection,

handling and processing, communication skills, safety and infection control, and other clinical skills integral to their upcoming role as members of the health care team. The student has the opportunity to apply the knowledge and skills gained in the theory and laboratory classes through completion of 100 venipunctures and clinical externship. After successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to sit for the certification exams through the National Healthcareer Association.

40 Clock Hours

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The EKG Technician Training Program is a 40-clock hour program for that prepares students for a career as an EKG Technician in hospitals, clinics, emergency and trauma centers, private physician offices, outpatient centers and extended nursing care facilities[.] Students gain essential knowledge and skills in preparing patients for testing, operation of electrocardiograph machine, and recording the 12 lead ECG rhythm stripes in a manner that provides reliable tests for the physician's interpretation[.] After successful completion of the program, the student is eligible to sit for the National Healthcareer Association Certification Exam[.]

REHABILITATION AIDE PROGRAM

24 Clock Hours

The Rehabilitation Aide Training is a continuing education program for licensed, certified, or registered healthcare providers, which is designed to provide them with knowledge and practical skills in rehabilitation services in order to perform tasks and activities designed and supervised by professional therapy personnel specifically designed to improve residents' functional abilities and/or prevent further deterioration.

Upon completion of the program, the student will be able to: ⇒ Determine his/her role as a Rehabilitation Aide

- in terms of the principles, policies & procedures of the rehabilitation and restorative programs;
- ⇒ Work under the supervision and direction of a Licensed Registered Physical Therapist (PTR/L) and/or Restorative Nurse in caring for patients with major neuromuscular, musculoskeletal, cardiac, and neurological disorders;
- ⇒ Assist patients in using assistive devices utilized in performing everyday activities;
- ⇒ Observe safety measures in and out of the health care facility; and
- ⇒ Recognize residents' rights in administering rehabilitation procedures and providing restorative care.



The IL Chapter Continuing Education Committee has approved this course according to the Criteria for Approval of Continuing Education offerings established by the Illinois Physical Therapy Association.

C.N.A. RECERTIFICATION

Certified Nursing Assistants in Illinois who have not provided nursing or nursing-related services for pay within a period of 24 consecutive months may undergo the Recertification process in order to regain certification and be listed on the Health Care Worker Registry.

Nursing Assistant Responsibilities: The first responsibility is to contact the Health Care Worker Registry. A letter outlining the process and procedure will be sent to the nursing assistant by the Registry.

In order for a nursing assistant to be eligible for recertification, he/she must:

- **1** PASS A MANUAL SKILLS PERFORMANCE TEST
 - \Rightarrow No findings of administrative abuse, neglect or theft
 - \Rightarrow Fingerprint criminal history records check (Health Care Worker Background Check Act)
 - \Rightarrow Choose date of evaluation from available clinical class schedules
 - \Rightarrow Demonstrate competence in all 21 Performance Skills with an Approved Evaluator

2 PASS A WRITTEN COMPETENCY TEST

- ⇒ Administered by Southern Illinois University at Carbondale (SIU-C)
- \Rightarrow Register for state exam online; choose preferred test site and date online
- \Rightarrow ICI State exam reviews available at no cost (reviewers & practice tests provided)
